10 & Under and 12 & Under Tournament Rules

- Payment and completed roster must be received prior to first game.
 - \$195 per team payable to Little Chenango Valley League.

General Rules

- Any unsportsmanlike conduct by a player, coach, or parent/spectator will result in ejection from the game or field and will carry over to the next game played, including the championship game. A suspended player, coach or parent will not be allowed to remain on the field.
- Rosters are restricted to 15 players, a manager, 2 coaches and a scorekeeper.
- Birth certificates are not required, however, if a player's age is questioned, proof must be shown before the next game. An ineligible player constitutes disqualification of the team.
- Only the manager (head coach) may address the umpire for clarification of rulings and protest situations.
- No infield practice or batting warm-ups prior to games on playing fields.
- Home teams will occupy 3rd base dugouts and will be responsible for keeping the official scorebook and game summary sheet.
 - Coin flip will determine home and away teams for Round Robin games.
 - The highest seeded team will be the home team for the playoff/championship rounds.
- Manager, 2 coaches, scorekeeper and players only are allowed in the dugouts.
- Managers, coaches and scorekeepers are allowed to wear shorts.
- Adult base coaches only.
- Each team must have 8 players to begin a game or continue – if less than 9 players are playing an out will be counted in the 9th spot in the lineup.
- All Round Robin games to be 6 innings with a 2 hour maximum time limit – no inning will be started after 2 hours.
- Round Robin games will be considered complete after 3 innings due to weather.
- Umpires or Tournament Committee has the sole discretion of calling games due to weather.
 - Games may restart after delays as long as the 2 hour rule is followed.

Playing Rules

- Each player must play in the field for at least six (6) consecutive defensive outs or be the EH for the game. Players not designated as the EH must play at least 6 consecutive defensive outs.
- If the team begins the game with an EH – the team must end the game with an EH. If a player is injured and the EH must move to the field no out will be counted in the EH lineup spot, however the EH must remain in his spot in the batting order.
- Starters may re-enter the game once, in the same spot in the batting order. If all subs have been used, a player can re-enter in a different spot in the batting order in the case of an injury.
- Mercy Rule: If after 3 ½ the home team is winning by 10 runs the game will be considered complete.
 - If the home team is losing they will be allowed to bat in their half of the inning.
- No head-first slides allowed – except when returning back to a base. A player sliding head-first will automatically be called out.

Playing Rules (cont.)

- ~~A player must give himself up or slide on all close plays, 'close plays' will be determined by the umpire.~~
Change of Rule 7/8/2010: 2010 Baseball Official Regulations and Playing Rules for Little League: Rule 7.08 (a) (3) states; "Any runner is out when the runner does not slide or attempt to get around a fielder who has the ball and is waiting to make the tag."
- A pinch runner will be allowed when the catcher of record is on base with 2 outs. The pinch runner must be the batter/runner that made the last out.
- No "slash-bunting" will be permitted. This is when a player squares as if to bunt, then pulls back and swings. This will be considered a dangerous play and will result in that pitch being called a strike regardless of the actual outcome of the pitch. The ball will be ruled dead and runners may not advance.
- Forfeits will be counted as a 6 – 0 score for the winning team.

Pitching Rules

- A pitcher may not pitch more than six (6) innings in any one game. A pitcher may pitch a maximum of six (6) total innings in two (2) consecutive games. One pitch constitutes an inning. A pitcher may not pitch in three (3) consecutive games. This rule does NOT re-set for the playoffs or championship game.
- There are no balks, however, the pitcher must pitch from the rubber.
- Intentional walks will be waived on to first base by the umpire with no pitches being thrown.
- A player removed from pitching may not return as a pitcher in the same game.
- A manager is allowed one trip to the mound or any other defensive position in one inning. On the second visit, the pitcher must be removed as pitcher. An injury visit does not constitute a visit, but must be deemed an injury visit by the umpire.

Playoffs & Championship Games

- Overall record in Round Robin play will determine the seeding for the playoffs
- Tiebreakers
 1. Head to Head Play
 2. Least Runs Allowed
 3. Coin Toss
- No time limit for playoff and championship games.

Tournament Committee has the sole discretion to modify these rules that are found to be in error.

Anything not covered above will follow the Official Little League Baseball Playing Rules.

Final Rule – This rule will be strictly enforced:
